- 2. Move Chad Hayes from level D2 to level D3 on the salary schedule for the 2015-16 school year.
- 3. Offer Kristi Gawel an 80% contract to serve district students and a 20% contract to serve the 66.0301 and open enrollment students.
- 4. Award Trent Probst an overload contract for the 2015-16 school year and modify the Assistant Athletic Director contract to eliminate pay as an event supervisor.
- 5. Increase the salary schedule base by \$650 for 2015-16.

Policy

In the event that an employee has no remaining personal or vacation days, and the deceased meets the relative definition under sick leave, the employee may use up to 2 days of sick leave to attend the funeral. Other request will follow the unpaid leave section of the handbook.

And renumber 11.04-11.06 to 11.05-11.07 respectively.

- 2. Add section II 5.07 Curriculum/Inservice Work outside of the Contract Staff who has preapproved curricular/inservice projects (usually during the summer months) will be paid \$20 per hour up to the approved number of hours.
- 3. Add section II 5.08 Other assignments
