The victory was even sweeter in front of the home crowd. The scoring girls who ran this meet last year improved a collective 11 minutes 49 seconds (2:57 average improvement per person).

The middle school girls' team finished second overall, and eighth graders Kiara Dach (second place) and Lia Constable (third place) earned individual spots on the podium. The boys team finished sixth, with sixth grader Bradley Hail earning a medal in seventh place individually.
